Assessment tasks include a written test, practical demonstration events and completion of a range of checklists.

Duration	Two full days on-site at our specialist 4WD training centre, plus pre- reading of the course notes (which will be emailed to you).	
	Note that this course may be combined with the one-day <i>Advanced 4WD Recovery</i> training program, in which case it would form day one & two of a three day training program.

competency	Participants who successfully complete all assessment requirements will receive a Statement of Attainment in this unit. Nationally Recognised Training	
Skills you will learn	The course covers the skills and knowledge needed to perform complex 4WD vehicle operations when negotiating rugged terrain and water crossings.	
Outcome	Participants who successfully complete all assessment requirements will receive a Statement of Attainment listing the above unit.	
Prerequisite training and experience	There are no formal prerequisite conditions specified for this competency. However, it is designed to follow on from our 'Introductory 4WD Operation' course (covering the unit: <i>TLIC0023: Operate four wheel drive vehicle</i>). If you have not already completed the introductory course, please contact us to discuss your situation.	

Training program and itinerary	If your employer has organised this course on your behalf, the training program and itinerary will have been negotiated with them. If you are enrolling as an individual, you will be sent the itinerary in advance. Accomm- odation	In most cases your employer will make the necessary accommodation arrangements. If you wish to arrange this yourself please note at the training centre we have Bunk style accommodation available, (you need to provide your own sleeping bag, pillow and bath towel). We also have a fully serviced campground on-site. Motel rooms are available in Braidwood and we can arrange these for you also. See the following pages for more details on these options.

Vehicle, equipment, licence and driving experience	
4WD vehicle	You will need to bring a registered, roadworthy 4WD vehicle that is fully insured and suitable for 4WD off-road use.
	We have vehicles available for hire on-site at Braidwood for people who are unable to bring their own 4WD vehicle.
	Please speak to us in advance if you wish to hire a vehicle or are not sure whether your own vehicle will be suitable for the course.
	If you are attending the course as part of a group, you may share a vehicle with another driver.
Fuel	Please ensure that you have at least 40 litres of fuel in your vehicle on arrival at the Castle View Training Centre. There is a service station in Braidwood.
Equipment	We will provide all 4WD equipment and other items necessary to complete the course.
	However, you should ensure that your vehicle is equipped with a spare tyre, wheel brace and jack.
Licence	You must hold a current driver's licence, valid in Australia for the vehicle you will be driving during the course. A provisional or full licence is acceptable. We must sight your license so bring it with you. Learner's licences are not permitted.
Off-road driving experience	To undertake this course, you must already be competent in basic off-road 4WD driving skills in a range of terrains and conditions,
	If you are undertaking the course in a manual vehicle, you must be competent in clutch control and manual gear changing.
	If you are unsure of your ability to successfully complete the activities involved, please phone us for further guidance.

	Off-road driving can be demanding, both mentally and physically, especially on rough terrain and in potentially hazardous situations.
Physical and mental requirements	To undertake the practical components of this course, you will need to be physically capable of carrying out tasks at ground level, such as changing a wheel and inspecting underneath the vehicle. You will also need to have the mental stamina to maintain your composure while driving under challenging conditions. If you are unsure of your ability to successfully complete the activities involved, you are welcome to phone us for further guidance.

On-site contact	
Phone and internet reception	Telstra mobile phone reception is available in the training room but limited elsewhere on the Castle View property. There is wifi via Starlink satellite service, the password will be provided at the centre. The landline contact number for the centre is: 02 4842 1414.

Other prerequisites	
USI	Before you fill in the enrolment form for this course, you must have a unique student identifier (USI). If you do not already have one, go to the USI website and create one at: www.usi.gov.au .
Literacy requirements	This is a very practical course with an emphasis on the hands-on skills needed to drive a 4WD in difficult terrains.
	However, there are still course notes to read and a written test to cover the theory component of the course. You will also be required to complete a simple risk assessment, pre-start checklist and other on-site forms.
	All materials are 'literacy assisted', written in plain English, and contain extensive diagrams and photos. Your trainer will provide onthe-spot help if you have trouble with any of the literacy tasks.
	If you believe you may need additional assistance with your language or literacy skills, please contact us in advance for further advice. We have a specialist literacy consultant available who can discuss the details with you.

Things to pack / clothes to wear	
Personal items	If you are staying in the on-site bunk house at Castle View, you will need to bring your own pillow, bed linen or sleeping bag, toiletries and a towel. Note that some of these items can be hired if required.
	If you wish to camp on-site, bring your own tent and camping gear.
	Always pack warm clothes. Remember that the Southern Highlands

	can be cold at any time of the year. Also pack wet weather gear, a hat or beanie and sunscreen.
Personal protective equipment	You will be required to wear sturdy, closed-in footwear, preferably boots. You should also pack gloves that are suitable for carrying out manual tasks.
	There is no specific requirement to wear high visibility vests – however, if you are attending as part of a work group (organised by your employer), you will be expected to wear all of the clothing items specified by your company for this type of activity.
Food and drink	Bottled water and soft drinks are available for sale at the training centre, or you may bring your own if you prefer. You should carry drinking water in your vehicle while on-site.
	There is a commercial kitchen and dining room at the centre. Meals may be provided as per the arrangements made with your employer, or with you personally if you enrol as an individual.
	If we are providing meals, please let us know in advance if you have any special dietary requirements. These will be accommodated if possible, but you may need to bring some of your own food items.

Pre-reading, assessment processes and course conclusion	
Pre-reading	There is a pre-reading pack accompanying this email, called: 'Supplementary notes for Advanced Driving'. These course notes are excerpts from the 2019 edition of Vic Widman's book: <i>4WD Driving Skills</i> (published by Landlinks Press).
	Please read these notes in preparation for the course and bring a copy with you to the training session. Most of these topics will be covered in full during the face-to-face training sessions, with plenty of time to discuss the concepts. You will also be given your own copy of 4WD Driving Skills during the course.
Assessment processes	The assessment process will be conducted at various points throughout the day. Assessment tasks include a written test, practical demonstration events and completion of a range of checklists.
	We generally find that participants are able to successfully complete the assessment requirements within the time allowed – however, there is provision for you to receive an extension in time if you are assessed as 'Not yet competent' at the end of the program.
	In instances where you require further practice in your skills before being re-assessed, we will discuss the options available to you at the conclusion of the course. If you have been sent by your employer, we will also discuss these options with your supervisor or manager.
Work placement	There is no requirement to undertake a 'work placement' in order to successfully complete this course. Although most of our course participants are already engaged in 4WD activities as part of their job

	role, it is not mandatory to gain workplace experience before undertaking the final assessment of competency.
RTO policies and procedures	In accordance with the legislation governing our activities as an RTO, we have written policies and procedures covering a wide range of administrative and organisational matters.
	These include: access and equity, on-site safety, harassment and behaviour, fees and refunds, complaints and appeals, and privacy.

	If your employer has booked you into the course, we will have already organised the fees and financial arrangements with them.

If you will be undertaking the course in a privately-owned vehicle, or a vehicle hired from an external company, you should also confirm with the insurer that this type of off-road driving and course participation will be covered under the insurance policy.

Note that all vehicles must be comprehensively insured.

Getting there


The address of the training centre is: 9792 Nerriga Road, Durran Durra, NSW.

Please refer to the map below and the description below for directions.

- From Goulburn, drive to the intersection of Kings Hwy and Braidwood Road and turn left (approximately 25 kilometres west of Braidwood)
- Follow the Kings Hwy to the town of Braidwood and turn left onto Nerriga Road.
- From Canberra, drive to Braidwood and turn left onto Nerriga Road.
- Follow Nerriga Road for 15 kilometres where you see a blue and white sign on your left. The sign reads: 'Castle View Training Centre, 9792 Nerriga Road, Durran Durra.
- Turn left at the sign, you need to drive through a shallow causeway at this point, it is safe to do so. Follow the track for 100 metres to the entrance of the property, park in front of the training room and come inside.

If you need further directions, you can ring us at the Centre on 4842 1414.

If using a navigation system do not use it with unsealed roads selected as it may direct you to a river crossing which is frequently in flood, use your navigation system to get to the town of Braidwood and then use it from Braidwood to find 9792 Nerriga Road, Durran Durra.
